- Your Way Home Montgomery County was established as the county's unified and coordinated housing crisis response system for families & individuals experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of homelessness. Our vision is to ensure that everyone who lives, works, learns, and invests in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania has equal opportunity to live in an affordable home and a thriving community. Services include:
  - A robust and multi-disciplinary Street Outreach team that can be deployed anywhere in the county 24/7.
  - Housing-Focused Emergency Shelter services, including centralized shelter bed management.
  - A broad cross-sector partnership that leverages and aligns federal, state, county, and private funding sources to achieve greater impact.

- Housing Counseling and/or Legal Services to divert people from entering shelters or becoming street homeless.
- Transitional Housing for select populations, including transitional age youth, people fleeing abuse and violence at home, and people in early stages of substance abuse recovery, among others.
- Permanent Supportive Housing for people with significant barriers to permanent housing stability.

▼Your Way Home is a network of different homeless service providers. These different providers operate programs which include street outreach, emergency shelter, rapid rehousing for homeless individuals and families, and court-based eviction prevention, among others. All services are administrated out of the county's Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Housing and Community Development.

In response to the need for expanded and enhanced trauma-informed and trauma-focused treatment for children and their families in Montgomery County, CCTC has expanded several of their programs into Montgomery County: Trauma Services, Family-Based Services, Outpatient Services, and Blended Case Management. The Trauma Services Program provides specialized trauma-focused treatment to children ages 18 months – 18 years who have recently witnessed or experienced a traumatic event or who have been the victim of sexual abuse/assault. The Family Based Program offers team-delivered, short-term intensive services in the home and community. This specialized program enables families to care for children with emotional and behavioral health challenges, thus reducing the need for out-of-home placement. This Outpatient Program offers a range of interventions that allow children and their families to learn ways to manage their behavior, understand their emotions, and more effectively communicate in their home, school, and community. The Blended Case Management Program works intensively with families to connect them to various resources within their community.

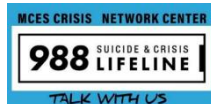

Our mission: We provide safe, temporary shelter and essential services that help families experiencing homelessness build a stable foundation for a sustainable future. We do not fall under the 211 County umbrella, so families and other agencies, such as schools and hospitals, can reach out to us directly. In our shelter program, each family receives biweekly case management with connections to resources such as childcare assistance and SNAP, and weekly classes in financial literacy, parenting, nutrition, or spirituality. The average length of stay is 4-6 months for 5 families at a time. We also offer 4 transitional housing apartments for our residents who are in school or other educational programs that will increase their income. The length of stay in Transitional Housing is 18 - 24 months. Residents in Transitional Housing participate in weekly case management and next-level classes that build on what they learned in the shelter classes.
